# Welcome Back Ordinary Time

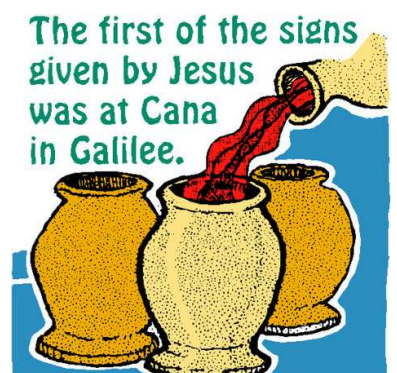
Once again, we are about to embark upon “Ordinary Time.” Ordinary Time is observed from the Monday after the celebration of the Baptism of the Lord, until the Tuesday (*Mardi Gras* for my Louisiana friends) before Ash Wednesday. It then continues on the Monday following Pentecost until the evening before Advent. The Liturgical color for this period is green, because it is the most ordinary color in our natural environment and is a symbol of everlasting life.

The English term “Ordinary Time” is derived from the Latin *Tempus Per Annum* (“time throughout the year”). Many sources suggest that Ordinary Time gets its name from the word *ordinal*, meaning “numbered,” since the Sundays of Ordinary Time are expressed numerically.

Basically, Ordinary Time encompasses that part of the Christian year that does not fall within the seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent, or Easter. Ordinary Time does not need to be “ordinary”, or mundane in our understanding of the word, and is not meant to mean that somehow we get a break from the Liturgical Year. In fact, the opposite is true: Ordinary Time celebrates “the mystery of Christ in all its aspects.” Many important liturgical celebrations fall during Ordinary Time, including, Trinity Sunday, Corpus Christi, All Saints, the Assumption of Mary, and Christ the King. In addition, the Church continues to celebrate Saints feast days and other events such as “The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity.” In fact this week of prayer is being observed right now; from Jan. 17<sup>th</sup> through the 23<sup>rd</sup>. We as a diocese are gathering together with other Christian denominations to pray in the unity of Christ at St. Charles Borromeo Catholic Church on Thursday, Jan. 21<sup>st</sup> at 11:30 am. I invite you all to attend in order to observe a desire of Jesus Himself, “so that they may all be one, as you, Father, are in me and I in you...” (John 17:21).

Ordinary Time is a period of 34 weeks in which we have the opportunity to walk with the Lord just as the disciples did, walking from place to place, day by day making each moment an intimate encounter with the Living God. May we embrace this season of “Ordinary Time” and make it a period of extraordinary growth.

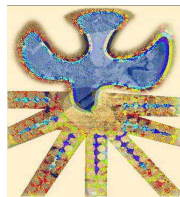

# MINISTERIO HISPANO

## Del Escritorio de Padre Scott

### Bienvenidos al Tiempo Ordinario

Una vez más, estamos a punto de embarcarnos en el "Tiempo Ordinario". El Tiempo ordinario se observa desde el lunes después de la celebración del Bautismo del Señor, hasta el martes (Martes de carnaval para mis amigos de Louisiana) antes del miércoles de Ceniza. Entonces continúa desde el lunes después de Pentecostés hasta la tarde antes del comienzo de Adviento. El color Litúrgico para este período es verde, porque es el color más ordinario en nuestro medio natural y es un símbolo de la vida eterna.

El término "Tiempo Ordinario" es derivado del Tiempo latino al año ("tiempo a través del año"). Muchas fuentes sugieren que el Tiempo Ordinario obtuvo su nombre del ordinal de palabra que significa "numeró," ya que los domingos de Tiempo Ordinario son expresados numéricamente.

Básicamente, el Tiempo Ordinario abarca esa parte del año cristiano que no incluye las temporadas de Adviento, Navidad, Cuaresma y Pascua. El Tiempo ordinario no debe ser "ordinario" ni mundano en nuestra comprensión de la palabra y no significa que de algún modo tenemos una interrupción del Año Litúrgico. De hecho, lo contrario es verdad: El Tiempo ordinario celebra "el misterio de Cristo en todos sus aspectos". Muchas celebraciones litúrgicas importantes caen durante Tiempo Ordinario, incluyendo, La Trinidad, el Cuerpo de Cristo, Todos los Santos, la Asunción de María y Cristo Rey. Además, la Iglesia continúa celebrando las fiestas de los Santos y otros acontecimientos como "La Semana de Oración para la Unidad cristiana". De hecho esta semana de oración es observada de enero 17 al 23. Como una Diócesis nos reunimos con otras denominaciones cristianas para orar por la unidad de Cristo en la Iglesia Católica de Charles Borromeo el jueves 21 de enero a las 11:30 AM. Yo los invito a asistir para observar el deseo de Jesús Mismo, "para que todos sean uno; como tú, Padre, en mí y yo en ti, que también ellos sean uno en nosotros, para que el mundo crea que tú me enviaste..." (Juan 17: 21).

El Tiempo ordinario es un período de 34 semanas en las que tenemos la oportunidad de andar con el Señor de la misma manera que los discípulos lo hicieron, andando de lugar en lugar, día a día creando momentos de encuentro íntimo con el Dios Vivo. Espero que abracemos esta temporada de "Tiempo Ordinario" y lo hagamos un período de crecimiento extraordinario.

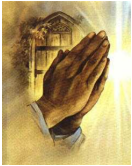
